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**Program Notes:** Students in the BA English program, no matter their concentration, will work with an advisor to ensure they earn 42 credits of advanced coursework at the 3000 and 4000 level. Students in the program will also be encouraged to add a 12 credit certificate to further their studies in Professional Writing, Creative Writing, or Literature. These certificates will include at least 6-9 additional credits of advanced coursework.
