Program Notes: Students in the BA English program, no matter their concentration, will work with an advisor to ensure they earn 42 credits of advanced coursework at the 3000 and 4000 level. Students in the program will also be encouraged to add a 12-15 credit certificate to further their studies in professional writing, creative writing or literature. These certificates will include at least 6-9 additional credits of advanced coursework. Students in the BA program are also likely to pick up a minor in a related discipline depending on their long-term goals. Careful advising will ensure they reach the 42 credits of advanced course work.

Course Notes: Courses marked with an * are repeatable for credit with a different topic. Several courses not listed here are also repeatable for credit (3200, 3210, 3300, 3310, 3380, 3400-3450, 4300, and 4400).

Concentration Notes: Students cannot exceed 12 credits in Literature (3300s and 4300s) or 12 credits (combined) in Writing, Creative Writing, Linguistics, or Literacy Studies (3200s, 3400s, 3600s, 3700s, or 4700s). The purpose of this restriction is to provide exposure to all the sub-disciplines of English. Additional credits beyond the 12 maximum credits in one area would count toward a student's free elective credits.
