### NOTE #1:

The RN-BSN program is a 3 semester program. It takes one year for students to complete the program unless they choose to attend part-time. Students are admitted every fall, spring, and summer semester. All courses 27-credits of core courses as well as a 3-credits nursing elective make up the 30 credits required for the program. The ASN and BSN students take the nursing electives as well, thus, we need to offer 2-3 nursing elective courses every fall, spring, and summer.

### Note #2:

Students typically transfer in all of their gen ed requirements. All gen eds from accredited community college grads are transferred in to meet the PW gen ed requirements. Diploma grads who transfer in typically need an art & humanity course, possibly a natural science class, and MATH 1220, or STAT 2000, or STAT 2020. Student prefer to take the math/stat class during the winter session or they will take it during their last semester so that they don't need to take more than 12 credits in a given semester.
