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**Program Notes:** Students in the BA English program, no matter their concentration, will work with an advisor to ensure they earn 42 credits of advanced coursework at the 3000 and 4000 level. Students in the program will also be encouraged to add a 12-15 credit certificate to further their studies in professional writing, creative writing or literature. These certificates will include at least 6-9 additional credits of advanced coursework.

**Course Notes:** Courses marked with an \* are repeatable for credit with a different topic. Several courses not listed here are also repeatable for credit (3200, 3210, 3300, 3310, 3380, 3400-3450, 4300, and 4400).

## Suggested Four Year Course Sequence

### Year 3

Note: At least one ENGL course must have the Gen Ed Intercultural Fluency designation, and at least two ENGL courses must have the Gen Ed Writing Intensive designation. At least one free elective or Gen Ed Discoveries course must have the Gen Ed Quantitative Applications designation, and at least one free elective or Gen Ed Discoveries course must have the Gen Ed Ethical Reasoning designation.

### Year 2
